On Saturday February 5, 2005, the Mississauga Lightning Special Olympics Floor Hockey team hosted its 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Invitational Tournament at Lincoln M. Alexander Secondary School. Twenty-two teams from across the Province came to compete in one of the largest Special Olympics events in the country! Over 500 athletes, coaches, volunteers, family members and friends saw the 36 games that resulted in great victories, offensive barnburners and some tight defensive classics! The Meaford Coyotes, were the first team to repeat as winners, capturing the D-division for the second year in a row, with an 8-2 victory over the Woolwich squad. The C-Level once again saw a new champ crowned as the high powered Cambridge Tigers defeated the defensive juggernaut Scarboro Cyclones 2-1 in a classic final game. The York South Hawks captured the third spot with a great 5-2 victory over the Hamilton Real McCoy's. 350 goals later and with over 950 minutes of floor hockey being complete, organizers finally had a chance to sit down and take a well-deserved rest!

Of course all the floor hockey lead to one thing: Awards! It is a tradition at the Mississauga tournament to reward all the athletes. 'Let me win'...and you get another game, 'but if I cannot win, let me be brave in the attempt'... and you will get a Trophy! Congratulations athletes for all of your hard work!
